Review of the Fairtrade Standard for Flowers and Plants (01.08.2022)

The project will be carried out according to the Standard Operating Procedures for the Development of Fairtrade Standards/Minimum Prices and Premiums. More information on these procedures can be found on the <u>website</u>.

Rationale for and justification of need for the project:

The Fairtrade Standard for Flowers and Plants is due for review, as part of the regular monitoring and review cycle. The review is also an opportunity to adapt and to ensure that the standard is in line with the Fairtrade global strategy 2021-2025 and contributes to its achievement. The strategy places great emphasis on empowered farmers and workers, growth and innovation, advocacy and digitalisation. The revision of the standard will mainly address the first two of these aspects.

The main focus of the review will therefore be:

- Wage improvement (but not wage levels)
- Human rights topics
- Environment
- Trade rules to help increase sales

Fairtrade recognizes the difficult financial situation faced by flower farms due to the covid pandemic and the war in Ukraine and therefore any topics related to wage improvement towards living wage will be addressed during the second round of consultation that will take place in guarter one of 2023.

Risk assessment:

Low participation in the consultation process

Mitigation

- Work hand in hand with Producer Networks and NFOs to motivate participation of certified producers and other actors in the flower/ plant value chain. The cases in which the presence of Fairtrade is under development, the local NFOs could play a key role in communication, liaising directly with stakeholders and engaging them in the project.
- Stakeholders with different degrees of engagement with Fairtrade flowers/ plants may
 expect that their input will lead to a specific standard revision or outcome, while not all
 suggested proposals for revisions from stakeholders are relevant in a global context.

Mitigation

 Stakeholders will be provided with a synopsis of all input received in the most transparent way possible, so they can understand how all input is weighed and solutions are devised for the best possible outcome for the flower and plant standard.. The input received from stakeholders with limited engagement with Fairtrade should not undermine the input from stakeholders actively engaged in the Fairtrade system (traders, packers, PNs and NFOs).

Project Goal and Objectives:

Goal: The goal of the review is to improve the Fairtrade Standard for flowers and plants so that it contributes to a greater sustainability of flowers and plants and trade, fairer trade practices and sustainable livelihoods for flower workers and their families.

Objectives:

- 1. Review and analyse outstanding issues included on the monitoring log on the Flower and Plant Standard since last revision
- 2. Seek solutions from stakeholders to resolve standard related issues
- 3. Consider options to improve wage measurement and reporting
- 4. Consider options to optimise the use Fairtrade Premium
- 5. Strengthen requirements to ensure decent working conditions in the labour conditions chapter
- 6. Strengthen the environmental requirements
- 7. Explore options to further increase flower volumes through retro-certification, regional auctions and bouquet composition rules
- 8. Ensure consistency in standards by aligning changes in all related product standards in particular the Fairtrade Standard for Hired Labour and Fairtrade Trader Standard
- 9. Improve standard language for better clarity and simplicity
- 10. Develop final proposals for the Flower standard for approval by Standards Committee
