# YOUNGER YEARS ACTIVITY: FROM LEAF TO CUP



**Activity Overview** 

Children will explore the journey of tea from farm to cup through storytelling, role play, and a creative matching game. The activity introduces Fairtrade values in a simple, engaging way.

# Part 1: Story Circle - A letter from Kenya

#### **Materials:**

- Simplified version of the letter from Kenyan tea farmers
- A globe or map to show Kenya

#### **Instructions:**

- Read aloud the friendly letter from Kenyan tea farmers.
- Show Kenya on the map and explain that this is where some tea comes from.
- Ask simple questions:
  - Who grows our tea?
  - What do farmers need to live well?
  - What does Fairtrade mean?

# Part 2: Tea journey role play

## **Materials:**

- Role cards: Tea farmer, Tea worker, Factory worker, Shop worker, Buyer
- A large poster or floor mat with a tea journey path



#### **Instructions:**

Assign each child a role and card.

Walk through the tea journey: Tea farmer → Tea worker
 → Factory worker → Shop worker → Buyer.

 As each child steps forward, they say one sentence about their role

**Tea farmer:** I grow the tea plants! **Tea worker:** I pick the tea leaves!

**Factory worker:** I dry and pack the tea! **Shop worker**: I sell the tea to people!

Buyer: I drink the tea!

# Part 3: Match & stick game

#### **Materials:**

• Glue sticks and A3 paper

#### Instructions:

- Cut the role cards up, separate the image from the description.
- Children match images and descriptions to the correct part of the tea journey.

## Part 4: What can we do?

## **Discussion prompts:**

- Why is it good to choose Fairtrade tea?
- What can we do at home or school to help?

# Wrap-Up:

End with a simple chant:

"Fairtrade tea, fair and kind,

Helps the farmers, peace of mind!"


